## Personally Speaking

### NON-JEWS ARE WELCOME IN OUR TENT

At the most recent conference of Reform rabbis, held this past January in San Francisco, there were many discussions and workshops about interfaith families in our congregations. I was most thankful to hear that for many of my colleagues these families are not a burden or a challenge, but rather, a great blessing! It is a fact of life that we are seeing an increasing number of these families joining our religious communities. I am so pleased by the number of interfaith families who belong to Congregation Or Chadash. At the same time, I am proud of those of you who are not Jewish, who feel that by belonging to this congregation you and your family find reward in your membership. Your choice to belong to our synagogue only strengthens our mission.

At the same time, I am aware of the challenges that many of you face. We need to come together to find the balance between preserving the integrity of Judaism and at the same time responding sensitively to the human needs of all involved. As your rabbi, I am reflecting on my role as a rabbi in your lives. This year, I am seeking to learn how I can more fully participate in the life cycle events of your family. That is all I can say at this time; but if you want to sit with me and discuss your personal needs and desires regarding birth, marriage, death—whatever the topic—I hope you are comfortable to call upon me at any time.

Due to our desire to be more proactive and clear about roles and involvement in synagogue life, Allen and Karen Erenberg have taken on the role of heading our Interfaith Committee, known as *Shalom LaKol* (All are Welcome). This year *Shalom LaKol* will reach out to our interfaith families and families in our community to provide leadership in discussing and finding common ground in how our families can participate

more fully in Jewish life and in the life of our congregation.

The prophet Isaiah, who lived in the sixth century BCE, said, *Enlarge the site of your tent, extend the size of your dwelling, spare not! Lengthen the ropes, and drive the pegs firm* (54:2). We at Or Chadash, since our inception, have been committed to welcoming those who are not Jewish as members of our sacred community. You are most welcome in our tent. But now it is time to do more. Let us first recognize outwardly:

- Intermarriage is a reality in the life of many;
- Many Jews will be brought closer to Judaism if there is a recognized place for their non-Jewish partner;
- Many non-Jews are actively offering their spirit, their talents, and their time to our community;
- Without violating the integrity of Judaism there are educational and leadership opportunities for those who are not Jewish;
- There needs to be a way to acknowledge the presence and the contributions of these members of our community.

Along these lines, the *Shalom LaKol* Committee will hold their first meeting on Sunday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m., and will be offering, for the first time, an educational program specifically for our interfaith families. On Monday, August 30<sup>th</sup>, I will be teaching a class *Negotiating Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur for Interfaith Families*. Please see the bottom of this page for an outline of this class.

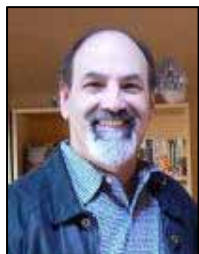

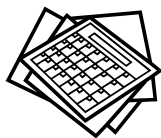

The current plan includes doubling the space of one of our classroom buildings to house weekly services, B'nei Mitzvah services, weddings, and other events. Once completed, we will be able to have virtually all of our religious and secular events on campus, with the exception of High Holy Day services, and will use our campus in this capacity until we achieve our eventual goal of a building a sanctuary.

Summer vacation is almost over and at Or Chadash we have been working hard to prepare for the upcoming year. A Religious School Information Packet was mailed to all of our students at the end of July. If you did not receive your child's packet, please call me at the office right away and we'll get one out to you.

Over the summer, one of the things I worked on with the help of the Religious School Education Committee was to map out the school year to help in planning both family and staff involvement. We had some very productive ideas that we hope to share with you throughout the year. Here are just a few examples of the ideas we

hope to put into action:

- Establish a core group of Room Parents, set up a meeting and training sessions to better utilize the parents' various skills and talents.
- Create a short communication survey to find out the best way to reach everyone.
- Invite all parents who drop off students on Sundays, to park their cars and join us for the first 10 minutes of Sunday school.
- Develop a Religious School Teachers' Wish List. Teachers will prepare a wish list of items needed in the class. Parents will be asked to check and see if there is an item they may be able to donate to their child's class.
- A small group of teachers got together over the summer to work on making our Religious school concept of Tzedakah (Charity) more meaningful to our students and parents. The task force will share their ideas with the rest of the staff during orientation and with the Religious School at our first gathering of the year towards the end of August.

There will be a Friday Night Family Shabbat Service to kick off the year with our incoming Sixth Graders to help lead the service on August 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at Handmaker. We hope to see all of our Religious School families join us there.

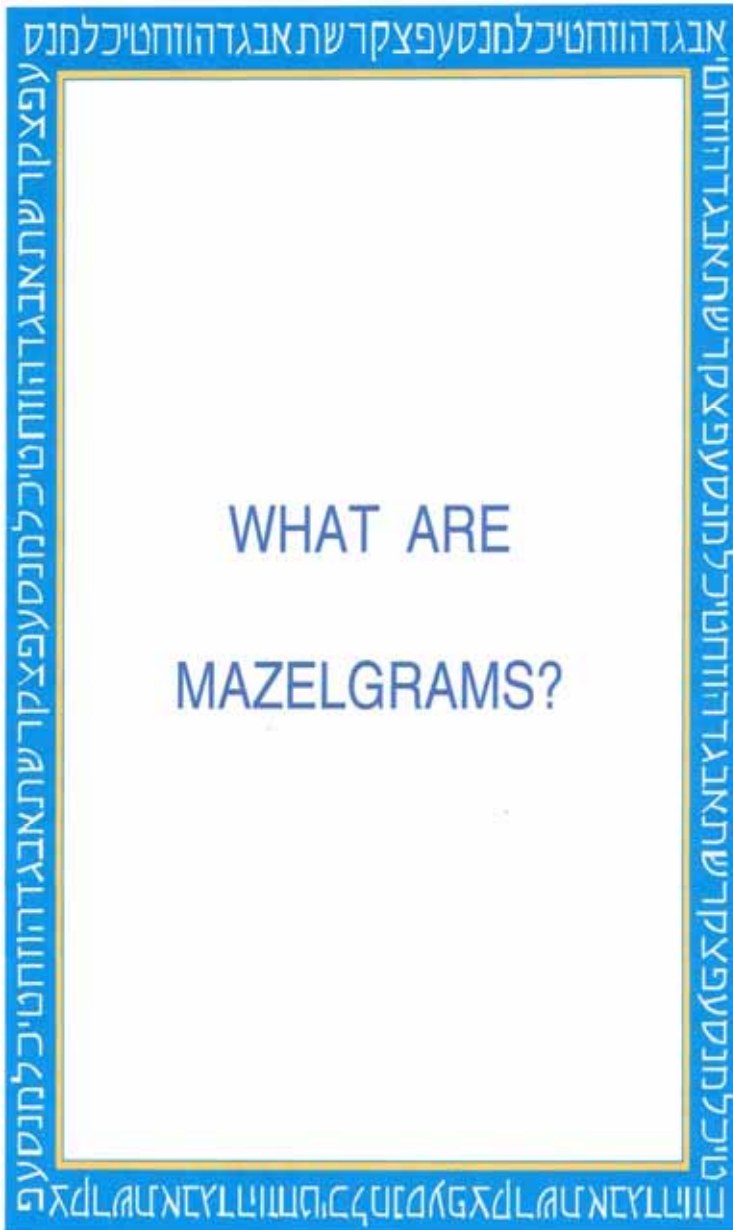

### SERVICE SCHEDULE

All High Holy Day Services, except Selichot and Tashlich, are at the Jewish Community Center  
(3800 E. River Rd.)

### SELICHOT

On Saturday, September 4 we come to our synagogues around the world to offer penitential prayers called *Selichot*. This is an evening of special introspection and preparation before Rosh HaShanah, four days later. Join our Rabbi and Cantor as we search and prepare together. We will gather in our chapel at 9:30 p.m. as we change our Torah mantles from colored to pure white. We will then join members of other congregations at Bet Shalom at 10:00 p.m. for a special study opportunity and prayer service which will end at midnight.

### CONTEMPORARY SERVICE

The services begin at 8:30 a.m. and the music features Cantor Cohen and members of our teen choir; a prayer book written at Or Chadash is used for this service. Many of our congregants serve as Torah readers. The service is accompanied by guitar and is a little less formal. ### TOT SERVICES

### CLASSIC SERVICES

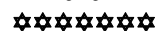
