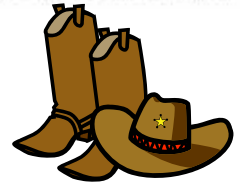

FROM THE RABBI
Promises Promises



There are nearly 30 references to oaths and vows found in our Scripture. There are dire consequences for broken vows. Why another one in our Torah portion and why is it directed to “the heads of the tribes of the children of Israel”? (Num. 30:2) Further, we read, “If a man makes a vow to Adonai or takes an oath imposing an obligation on himself (*nafsho*), he shall not break his pledge; he must carry out all that has crossed his lips” (Num. 30:3). Why distinguish the leaders from everyone else? Nachmanides suggests that the law was not originally made public in order to discourage the practice. I believe that the intention is to direct this to the leaders because of their influence upon their

followers’ actions.

The responsibility of leadership involves the ability to accommodate communal needs and keep the community happy, whatever that community may be: work, family, organizations. Individuals have desires and gripes and groups have vested interests. Leaders need to serve and be sensitive to both. A vow is a promise, and promises are made to deliver the goods. This law reminds us of the sanctity of the word and importance of keeping promises and oaths, specifically those made by leaders. Leaders have a greater need to be exemplary. A fulfilled promise is an indication of honesty and reliable leadership. Followers feel inspired and respected by leaders who keep every word they give.

Your promise is a commitment to action that your followers trust. The more you keep your promises the greater your followers trust your word, which becomes the antidote to the fears and risks attendant to your community’s making a meaningful commitment. Trust is reliance on you, the leader, to not speak or act in a way that is harmful to your interests. The implication that the leader will guide followers to a better place and the followers will feel valued and treated respectfully is one of the most important assets of any organization or family. When your leader keeps a commitment, your trust in your leader increases and your leader can call upon that trust. Your leader can make mistakes and that trust level still can remain high. Making and keeping promises to ourselves and to others, little by little increases our strength until our ability to act is more powerful than any of the forces that act upon us.

Acting in this responsible way means, deeply and spiritually, holding oneself accountable (*nafsho*). We need to know that our leaders’ words and actions are directly related to the welfare of others and the success or failure of our organization. Whether these are your children or your employees, your followers build their hope around promises you make. Perhaps this is what Rashi was thinking when he commented on the dire consequences for “breaking” one’s commitment by noting that the word, “break” (*yakhel*) is related to *kehallel* (“to secularize”). The spoken word is holy. Don’t secularize it! Words like the ones God used in Genesis chapter one created the world. Words make reality. Uttering a promise implies a divine creation to which you are committing yourself. By making promises, setting goals and being true to them, we are able to make possible every other positive thing in our lives.

Questions:

1. How do you feel when someone makes a promise to you and doesn’t keep their word or makes excuses to get out of it?
2. If a “vow” is not faithfully honored, then how can you be trusted?

Focus:

Make a promise to someone. Check out the reaction of the other person. The lack or excess of trust in their reaction is an indication of how well you have fulfilled past commitments.

7TH GRADE YOUTH PHILANTHROPY GROUP RAISES OVER \$4000 FOR GOOD CAUSES

Congregation Or Chadash 7th Grade Youth Philanthropy Program chose to donate the \$4,300 they raised throughout the year to programs serving children with diabetes.

On Sunday, May 2nd, the Youth Philanthropy Fund awarded \$1,000 to the American Diabetes Association for their Feria de Salud Community Education Program; \$2,500 to the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation for their Adventure Week Children's Camp; and \$800 to the Homer Davis Child Nutrition Project.

During the school year, 12 Congregation Or Chadash seventh grade religious school students hosted bake sales, organized and ran the Purim carnival with activity booths and food for sale, raising the money to donate to community organizations that work with children. After narrowing their focus to children with diabetes, they requested proposals from organizations that desired funding for their programs. The committee reviewed all of the proposals submitted and made its selection of requests to fund.

The Youth Philanthropy Program promotes leadership and philanthropy and these Seventh Grade participants exemplify the values of compassion and caring so often overlooked in today's youth.

**MY EXPERIENCE VISITING PRISON:
PLEASE HELP**

About a year ago I began to attend meetings for the newly re-established Caring Committee at our synagogue, Congregation Or Chadash. For this committee, we visit people in hospitals, those ill at home, new babies, and assist in delivering food. We try to do whatever we can do to help. As part of my community involvement, I also visit prisons here in Tucson and in California as part of another service group I take part in.

The men in the prison have been really grateful for my visits. Before I started coming they only were allowed to get together one time a week for Shabbat. Now, because of my visits, they can gather for an additional day.

At our gatherings, we talk about the week's Torah portion, the Holidays and sometimes we just have an open sharing session. As you can imagine, sometimes they are upset over something, so we talk and usually find a text to study (usually Job or a Psalm) that talks about overcoming difficulties, primarily by having faith in G-d and being patient. Some know very little about our Religion and some are really learned scholars.

Following my most recent meeting at the prison, I attended a function for all the volunteers who go into our nine local prisons. The man who is in charge of this for the entire State of Arizona made a point of saying that of all the thousands of volunteers here in Arizona I am the only Jewish Chaplain.

In part of my commitment to visiting the prisons, I thought it would be great to have new Jewish visitors to help these men study Judaism. Please contact me if you are interested.

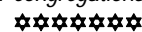
CONGREGATION OR CHADASH CEMETERY LOTS
